Next, the examiner conducts an interview with the candidate about his/her studies, future or already completed work, professional plans, interests.</p> <p>(In each set, in the examiner's version, there are 2 questions).</p>	5 p.
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Task 2</b> 5 minutes <b>PRESENTATION</b></p>	<p>The candidate presents a previously prepared topic from the following category: <b>innovative</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- product/device</li> <li>- process</li> <li>- system</li> <li>- service</li> </ul> <p>directly related to the field of study.</p> <p>The presentation must have a formal sales pitch structure and contain expressions/vocabulary characteristic of this form.</p> <p>It is required to illustrate the presentation with <b>visual material</b> (max. 5 elements), which is also assessed and attached to the examination report. Visual materials must be marked with a <b>registration number and the student's name</b>.</p>	8 p.
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Task 3</b> 5 minutes <b>DISCUSSION</b></p>	<p>The presentation is immediately followed by a discussion - question-answer session in which the candidate and both examiners participate. Number of questions unlimited. There is a time limit of 5 minutes.</p>	7 p.
